Feedback Report:

Feedback on syllabus is collected from various stakeholder viz. students, teachers and alumni during the current assessment year. The feedback is randomly collected from the final year (5th and 6th semester) students both major and non-major by offline mode using a predesigned and pretested questionnaire, The questionnaire contains 10 questions. A scale of 5 rating point analysis ranging from '1' to '5', where '1' is for Excellent, '2' for Very good, '3' for Good, '4' for Satisfactory and '5' for Poor. The feedback was also collected from the alumni and the teachers. After collecting the feedback, the data are analyzed by an Expert Team. The analysis reveals that regarding the contents and units of the syllabus. 50 percent students remarks are found very good, 24 percent good, 18 percent excellent and 8 percent satisfactory, 34 percent students commented that the size of the syllabus in terms of load is very good. Same number of percentage are in favour of Good, 20 percent Excellent, 10 percent Satisfactory and only 2 percent commented as Poor, 32 percent students commented that the units/sections of the syllabus are sequenced as Very good. 30 percent simply rate as Good, 26 percent Excellent, 8 percent Satisfactory and only 4 percent as Poor. Regarding the allocation of credits to the course, the responses from students are found as 34 percent for very good, 32 percent Good, 26 percent Excellence, 6 percent satisfactory and 2 percent poor respectively. In respect of flexibility of the curriculum and elective courses the students responded like 38 percent very good, 30 percent excellent, 20 percent good and 20 percent satisfactory. For availability of standard study materials, the remarks of the students are like this 42 percent -Very good, 28 percent - Good, 20 percent - satisfactory, 10 percent -Excellent and 6.00 per cent Poor and only 2.00 per cent Excellent are the responses of the students for the use of ICT tools at the time of curriculum delivery. When the students are asked to rate the relevance of syllabus to recent trends and development, the ratings are like 38.00 per cent Very good, 34.00 per cent Good, 8.00 per cent Excellent, 8.00 per cent Satisfactory and 4.00 per cent Poor respectively. 36.00 per cent Good, 32.00 per cent Very good, 14.00 per cent both for Excellent and Satisfactory and only 4.00 per cent. Poor are the responses for the point the proportion of field work/project work/ practical incorporated in the syllabus. In response of applicability/relevance of the syllabus in real life situation the responses of the students are found as 30.00 per cent Very good 28.00 per cent Good, 20.00 per cent Satisfactory, 8.00 per cent Poor and 4.00 per cent Excellent respectively.

It is also found that more than 70.00 per cent students give their comment on three parameters viz. Excellent, Very good and Good.

Feedback from alumni and the faculty members are collected by some objective as well as subjective questions. Considering all the comments and suggestions very carefully, the following important suggestions are sorted out and submitted to the authority.

- Curriculum should be more relevant to the international standard, more flexible, and more scope is there to include the value based and ethics related courses in the curriculum.
- 2. There should be more emphasis on the job-oriented curriculum.
- Sufficient number of prescribed books and reading materials should be made available in the library.
- 4. More field work/project based subject should be added to the curriculum.
- 5. More practical aspects should be incorporated in the syllabus.
