01. NORTH KAMRUP COLLEGE

A PROFILE

North Kamrup College, one of the premier institutions of higher education is situated erstwhile in Tribal Sub-Plan area under the traditionally enlightened Barpeta district of Assam. It was established on the 17th August, 1979.

At an early stage of 1978, a team of socially dedicated persons of greater Baghmara area felt the need for a higher educational institution for the welfare of the society as well as the student community of the greater Baghmara area. Later, with the relentless support of the people with their humble monetary contribution and cordiality the institution of higher education named North Kamrup College (Arts Stream) came to light in 1979. The College started and grown in a remote rural area like Baghmara against many odds like lack of smooth communication as one of them.

The College is 13 km. North from Pathsala, of Bajali. Now the International Highway No. 127-A from Bhutan to Pathsala is running through Baghmara. Baghmara, where the College is located is a place known for Trade and Business. Historically, Baghmara Bazar was famous for exchange of various goods between the Assamese and the Bhutanese. People residing in the locality are having diverse ethnic identity and colourful cultural heritage. The landscape surrounding the College encovers a spacious campus of 33 Bighas of land covered by boundary walls.

The founder Principal of this College was Prof. M. M. Datta, a renowned educationist while veteran Physicist late Dr. P.C. Mahanta (Dean, Faculty of Science, GU.) was the first President of the G.B. and late Dr. Ananta Mohan Das, a Physician and a social worker of repute had the privilege of leading the institution as the Secretary of the public body (G.B). The College vows to attain progress and run ahead in the days to come with the unsparing support of the students, the guardians, the society by and large and the alumni as it is launched and meant for attainment of excellence in higher education. Since its inception, this institution has been playing a significant role in the socio-cultural and literary field of Assam. Today it has emerged as a leading College in Assam by keeping pace with the changing world.

The College campus bears a large number of valuable trees and in collaboration with the Department of Social Forestry, Govt. of Assam, seedlings of valuable trees like Saal, Nahar, Teak, Sishu, Gameri etc. are being produced in 5 Bighas of college land which are likely to help in creating environmental awareness among the students.

03.23 Details of the Three/Four-year Degree Course under GU/BU-FYUGP

The B.A. follow the CBCS system.

Some Important Points of GU/BU-FYUGP Based on CBCS

- 1) The academic work in each semester will require the student to engage with chosen courses, the content of which will be described in detail in the syllabi. Every course will have defined learning objectives and may be designed to comprise lectures, tutorials, laboratory work, field work, project work or any other activity that addresses the learning objectives of the course.
- 2) Each course will have credits, assigned on the basis of course related activities, which a student will earn through satisfactory fulfilment of the academic requirement of the course as per the Affiliating University. .
- 3) An undergraduate degree programme with Honours in a discipline will have a course credit requirement of 148 credits while an undergraduate degree program without Honours will require a student to earn 132 course credits. Students in an Honours programme can opt to earn additional credits by undertaking additional Elective courses subject to the condition that the total number of course credits does not exceed 160 credits. For a student in a Regular programme, this credit ceiling will be 140 credits. The credits earned beyond the mandatory programme requirement will not be taken into consideration in computation of the student's grade but will be recorded in the grade sheet.
- 4) The medium of instruction and examination will be held in English and/or Assamese, except in language courses.

03.24 Nature and Nomenclature of Courses:

In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorized as Core courses, Elective courses or Ability Enhancement courses

03.241 Core Course : A Core course is a course that has to be compulsorily studied. A student in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up 14 core courses, each of 6 credits. In a Regular undergraduate



degree programme a student will need to take up 12 core courses, each again of 6 credits.

- 03.242 Elective Course:** An Elective course is to be chosen by the student from a pool of such courses on offer and will essentially be of three types:
- Discipline Specific Elective Course:** An Elective Course which is offered by the main discipline. The discipline offering a Discipline Specific Elective course may also offer discipline related elective courses that are interdisciplinary in nature. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to earn 24 course credits from Discipline Specific Elective courses. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree programme in science, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 36 credits. For a student enrolled in a non-Honours undergraduate degree programme in Arts and Commerce, the course credit requirement from Discipline Specific Elective courses will be 24 credits.
 - Generic Elective Course:** A Generic Elective Course is offered by an unrelated discipline and has the objective of broadening the academic experience of a student. A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours can acquire 24 course credits from Generic Elective Courses. A Core Course offered in a discipline may be allowed as an Elective to a student from another discipline. This course will be treated under the category of Generic Elective Courses. Generic Elective Courses are not available to students in a non-Honours undergraduate science degree programme while other non-Honours undergraduate programmes require enrollees to take up two such courses.
 - Dissertation/Project:** Engaging students in a Project/Dissertation work, which requires knowledge application and problem solving, is considered to be important in the learning process. All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program (Honours and non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of a 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only.
- 03.243 Ability Enhancement Courses:** Ability Enhancement Courses which are to be taken up by students in an undergraduate degree programme will be of two types:
- Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses:** These 4 credit courses are mandatory for every student enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme. A student will have to take up 4 credit course in Environmental Science and a second 4 credit course in English Communication/ MIL Communication.
 - Skill Enhancement Courses :** Skill Enhancement Courses will be value-based or skill-based and there will be a pool of courses on offer. A student



enrolled in an undergraduate degree programme with Honours will have to take up a minimum of two SEC courses of 4 credits each as part of the programme requirement. For students enrolled in non-Honours undergraduate degree programmes the credit requirement from Skill Enhancement Courses will be 16 credits. It is desirable that the university will prepare Skill Enhancement Courses for various disciplines from the list of SEC provided by the UGC template. However, colleges are free to develop their own SECs independently which must have prior approval of the Academic Council.

03.244 Value Added Course :

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups – (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 2-credits, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2 & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

03.245 Multidisciplinary subjects

As mentioned before, the multidisciplinary subjects are Class XII-standard subjects. In GU/BU FYUGP, the entire multidisciplinary group is divided into 6 categories (for Arts 3 categories). All these categories will have three papers each, to be studied during Semesters 1-3. Below, we list these categories and their broad contents.

- 1. Computer Application**
Introductory Computer Applications and Programming, Information Technology
- 2. Information & Media**
Basic Information and Media, Mass Media and Communication
- 3. Humanities & Social Science**
Basic Economics, Political Science, History, Philosophy, and Psychology, Women's and Gender Studies

A student's performance will be monitored by the teachers throughout the semester by continuous assessment in the theory and practical works. Evaluation in each theory and practical paper will be as follows :

Internal Evaluation : 40% marks (includes one Sessional Exam and one assignment/project/seminar and attendance)

External Evaluation : 60% marks (conducted by Gauhati University)

Internal evaluation shall be based on sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars, library works in each semester, while external evaluation shall be through a final examination at the end of the semester. The pass marks on each theory paper is 40% and each practical paper is 40%. Students must secure pass mark in both internal and external evaluation test separately.

04 NEP- 2020 AND GU/BU-FYUGP

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) under GU/BU is based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as societal well-being. The policy also endeavours developing India as envisioned in its Constitution – a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured, and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. NEP 2020 notes that “given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals”.

The FYUGP is designed to cater to the diverse academic needs of the student and seeks to offer options of multiple entries / exits and obtain a Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with or without Major or a Degree (Honours) or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

04.1 Definitions

04.11 Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

CBCS means is a flexible system of learning where ‘Credit’ defines the quantum of contents/ syllabus prescribed for a course and determines the number of hours of instruction required.

04.12 Programme

The term ‘programme’ is used to mean the whole learning experience or combination of courses under FYUGP leading to a Certificate, Diploma or Degree. The traditional concept of ‘course’ is replaced by ‘programme’.

04.13 Course

A Programme is divided into a number of ‘courses’. A course is a unit of instruction or segment of subject area under any programme. The traditional concept of ‘paper’ is replaced by ‘course’.

04.14 Academic Year

An academic year means a period of twelve months consisting of two semesters comprising of a total of 180 working days.

04.15 Semester

The word ‘semester’ is used to mean a half-yearly term or term of studies comprising of 90 working days including examinations, vacations and semester breaks.

04.16 Summer Term

A summer term is for eight weeks which includes summer vacation. Internship/apprenticeship/work-based vocational education and training can be



carried out during the summer term, especially by students who wish to exit after two semesters or four semesters of study. Regular courses may also be offered during the summer on a fast-track mode to enable students to do additional courses or complete backlogs in coursework.

04.17 Major

Major is the discipline or subject of main focus and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (50% of total minimum credits) through core courses in the concerned discipline.

04.18 Minor

Minor is the discipline that helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the Major discipline.

04.19 ABC and SAMARTH e-Govt. Admission Portal, Assam

SAMARTH e-Govt. Admission Portal, Assam and ABC (Academic Bank of Credits) refers to the initiative of the Ministry of Education, Government of India where a student's academic credit is consistently deposited into the ABC.

04.2 Programme and Curricular Components

04.21 Overview and structure

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a maximum credit allocation of 22. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3-year programme is 120 and for a 4-year programme, its 160. The minimum credit requirements for GU's/BU's FYUGP is as follows:

- (a) Semester I : 22
- (b) Semester II : 22
- (c) Semester III : 22
- (d) Semester IV : 18
- (e) Semester V : 18
- (f) Semester VI : 18
- (g) Semester VII, VIII : 40
- (h) Total : 160

04.22 Course-wise credit requirements

Below, we provide the minimum credit requirement for various course along with a mention of their semesters.

04.221 Core Course

- a) First Major : 60 (Semesters 1-6)
- b) Minor : 12 (Semesters 1-6)
- c) Second Major (Double Major) : 48 (Semesters 1-6)



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04.222 Common Course

- Multidisciplinary : 9 (Semesters 1-3)
- Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) : 9 (Semesters 2, 4-6)
- Valued Added Course (VAC) : 6 (Semesters 1, 3)
- Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) : 8 (Semesters 1, 2)
- Internship : 4 (in any Semester from 3-6)
- Research Methodology : 4 (in any Semester in 5 or 7)

04.223 For Honours and Honours with Research

- Advanced Core, Dissertation : 36 (Semesters 7, 8)

04.23 Free credits

In a 3-year duration of the FYUGP, a student can avail up to 12 free credits, 4 credits each in Semesters VI-VI. A student can either utilise these free credits to study another Minor or a course from 4th year of the course or can just not utilise them at all. See the section on Degree Options to know how to utilise these free credits.

04.3 Curricular components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is be divided into two parts – (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

04.31 Core courses

The core courses constitute Majors and Minors. Usually, a student will choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. All together, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3-year programme. Major Course The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course over a 3-year period is 60 which translates to 15 courses (papers). Minor Course The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period is 12 which translates to 3 courses (papers). Second Major Course Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, s/he can convert one of her Minor Courses to a Second Major only with a credit allocation of 48. In that case, s/he gets a degree with Double Major and Minor. So, in general the total credit requirements of 84 in core courses translates to a single Major and two Minors. But a student can choose otherwise as well. To know how, see the section on Degree Options.

04.32 Common courses

As the name suggests, these courses will have to be studies by all students of FYUGP. Together the common courses have a credit allocation of 36 divided over five subdivisions. They are



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- (a) Value Added Courses (VAC) : Total Credits 6
- (b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) : Total Credits 8
- (c) Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) : Total Credits 9
- (d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) : Total Credits 9
- (e) Internship : Credit 4

A brief description of these courses are given below.

04.321 Multi-Disciplinary Courses (MDC)

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects – (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses are of Class XII.

Each student need to take at any three courses, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

04.322 Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is a 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication).

Each student need to complete two courses of 4-credits each - one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1-2.

04.323 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have four skill courses starting from Semester 1 and in Semesters 4-6.

04.324 Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups – (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 2-credits, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2 & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

04.325 Internship

All student are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.



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04.4 ABC (Academic Bank of Credits)

The GU/BU-FYUGP is directly connected to the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earn at the end of an examination in GU/BU-FYUGP, will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such it is mandatory that a student under GU/BU-FYUGP register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

04.5 Progression and exits

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

04.51 After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirements is 44 (and 4 credit extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

04.52 After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational / Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirements is 84 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational / Skill course).

04.53 After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years, s/he can exit the programme. In this case the student will get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirements is 120.

04.54 After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirements is 160.

It should be noted that any certificate / diploma / degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e. passes) all the required courses (papers) till that point of time.

04.6 Multiple exits and entries

The FYUGP allows students to have multiple exits and entries. That is a student can exit the programme, say after one year (as shown above) and then again can enter the programme at a later time and can continue the programme from where s/he left. This process can be executed multiple times.

However, the entry into the programme is subject to availability of positions at that point of time and in that institute/college. Besides, the following should apply

04.61 A student will get a certificate / diploma / degree on exit from the GU/BU-FYUGP (depending on in which year the student exits), only when the student passes in all the minimum compulsory courses at that point of time.



04.62 After an exit, either after Year 1 or 2, the student can seek an entry only into the same programme to which the student was admitted.

04.63 When a student exits the GU/BU-FYUGP after 3 years with a Bachelor's Degree, s/he can not seek reentry into the programme at the fourth year, rather s/he will need to take admission into the Master's programme at the first year.

04.64 As the contents (syllabi) of all the courses are subject to modification from time to time, when a student enters into the programme after an earlier exit, the contents of all courses will be what is as per the syllabi at the current point of time.

04.7 Inter-institution mobility

The GU/BU-FYUGP allows a student for inter-institutional mobility, both for incoming and outgoing students. For this, GU/BU will take into account the credits a student has in his / her ABC.

For an incoming student, the following should be observed:

- The entry is subject to availability of seats in the concerned discipline.
- The student need to fulfill all the academic prerequisites of the concerned discipline.
- Gauhati University will award a degree to a student, only when the student will have completed 60% of the credits for core courses from GU.

04.8 Degree options

Broadly the FYUGP will have two degree options – (a) Degree in a Stream and (b) Degree in a Discipline. In all cases, the requirements of core and common courses remain same.

04.81 Degree in a stream

Different subjects of FYUGP is divided into three broad streams – (i) Arts, (ii) Science, (iii) Commerce & Management, and (iv) Interdisciplinary. There are the following options under this category.

04.811 Degree with Major and Minors

In this case, a student studies one Major subject which consists of 15 courses and two Minors which consists of 6 courses (3 for each Minor). The student can also utilise the free credits to study another Minor as well (3 more core courses in another subject).

04.812 Degree with only Minors

In this case, a student studies all the three core courses equally over a period of 3-year programme.



04.813 Degree with double Major

In this case, a student needs to utilise all the free credits (12 in total) to study 3 more courses of one of the Minors and earn another 24 credits from MOOCs (subject to permission) on the same Minor to earn total credit of 48. In this case, the student gets a second Major in that subject (the Minor subject).

It should however be noted that a second Major (or double Major) can be obtained only if the student earns the first Major.

04.814 Nomenclature

The nomenclature of the degree in the above cases will be such as Bachelor of Arts / Science / Commerce / Management.

04.82 Degree in a discipline

In this case, a student studies all the 21 core courses from a discipline designed for that purpose. These kinds of degrees will not have any Major or Minor. An example would be Bachelor's Degree in Information Technology or Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration etc.

There will primarily three types of degrees in a discipline. They are

- Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline
viz. Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration.
- Bachelor's of Arts / Science in a Discipline
viz. Bachelor's Degree in Science in Microbiology.
- Bachelor's of Vocation or Bachelor's Degree (Vocation) in a Discipline
viz. Bachelor's Degree (Vocation) in Small tea Garden Management

04.9 Choice of courses

04.91 Prerequisites

Prerequisites are conditions which need to be fulfilled prior to admission into the FYUGP. Each subject and its course (paper) has their own prerequisites, which need to be fulfilled by a student prior to enrollment. For example, having Class XII-level Math is a prerequisite required to opt for Physics at the FYUGP.

Here, having a prerequisite necessarily means that the student needs to have passed in the subject. The details of these prerequisites are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.

04.92 Requirements

As opposed to prerequisites, the requirements are conditions which need to be fulfilled when a student chooses a certain subject or course. For example, when a student wants to study Botany as a subject, Chemistry as another subject must be studied.

The details of the requirements are available in the FYUGP Information Booklet.



04.93 Course options

Subject to fulfillment of prerequisites and requirements, a student can choose any subject as core subjects. The nomenclature of the degree awarded (whether Bachelor of Arts or Science) will be decided by the group to which at least two subjects belong.

04.94 Learning outcomes

The GU/BU-FYUGP courses are based on LOCF (Learning Outcomes based Curriculum Framework) as defined in the UGC's Curricular Framework for the same.

04.10 Examination & grading

04.101 Examination

The examination modalities of GU/BU-FYUGP will be as per GU's/BU's Examination Ordinance.

04.102 Grading

After successful completion of the programme, a student will be awarded grade. In GU/BU-FYUGP, there will not be any percentage of marks, but all students will be provided SGPA (Semester Grade Point Average) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) as per UGC's Curricular Framework.

04.11 Fourth year of the GU/BU-FYUGP

The fourth year of the GU/BU-FYUGP consists of one compulsory course on Research Methodology of credit 4, to be studied in Semester VII. The rest of the course consists of Advance Core Courses and a Dissertation. The details of the fourth year will be available later.

All students, irrespective of their choice of subjects or degrees can advance to the fourth year either for a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research.

04.111 Fourth year and college

All colleges under GU/BU are allowed to conduct courses for the fourth year of GU/BU-FYUGP, as per published guidelines and syllabi from GU/BU, leading to the Bachelor's Degree (Honours).

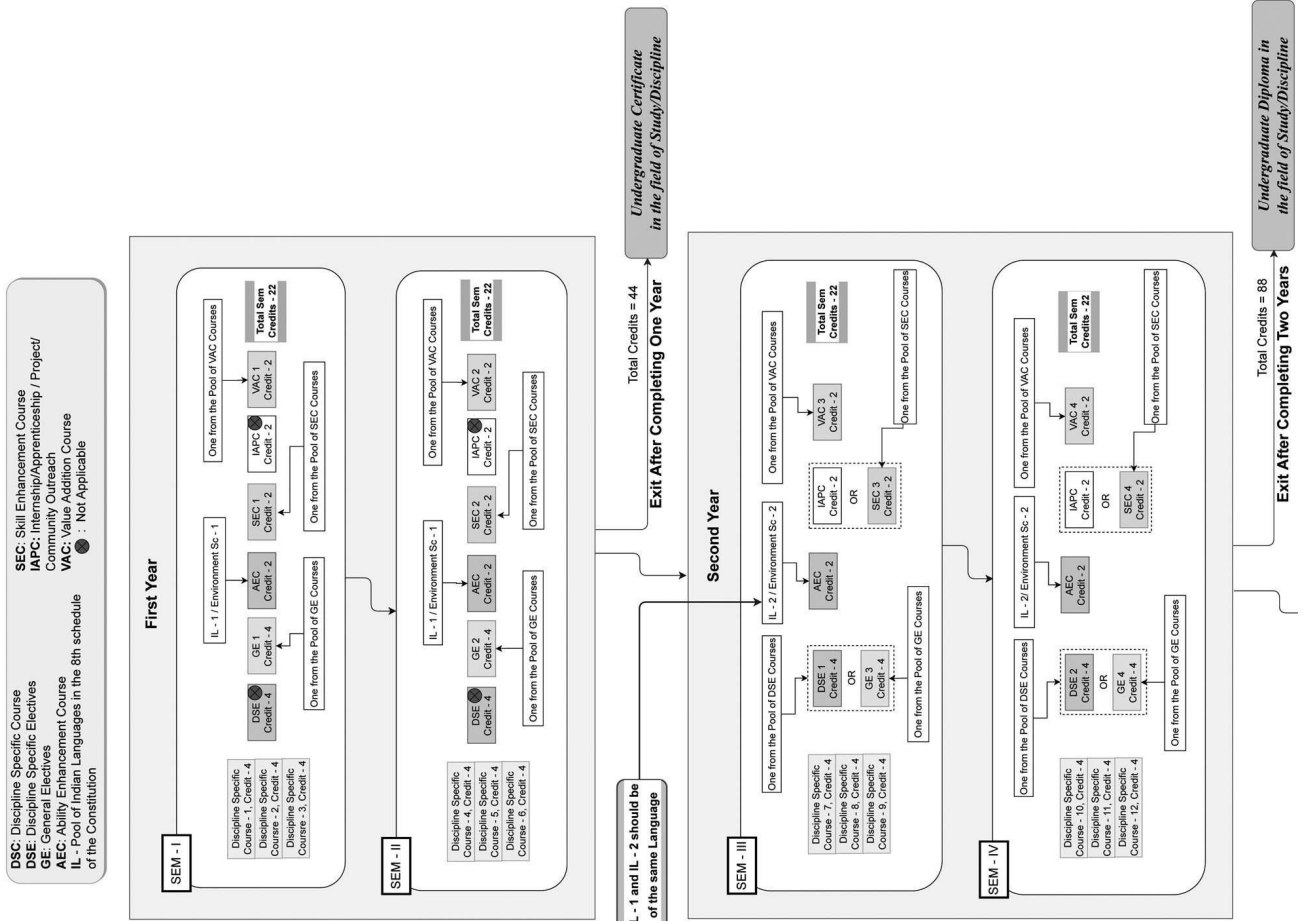
However, to conduct courses for the fourth year leading to the Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research, a college must obtain a prior approval from GU/BU, the detailed procedure and guidelines for which will be published later.

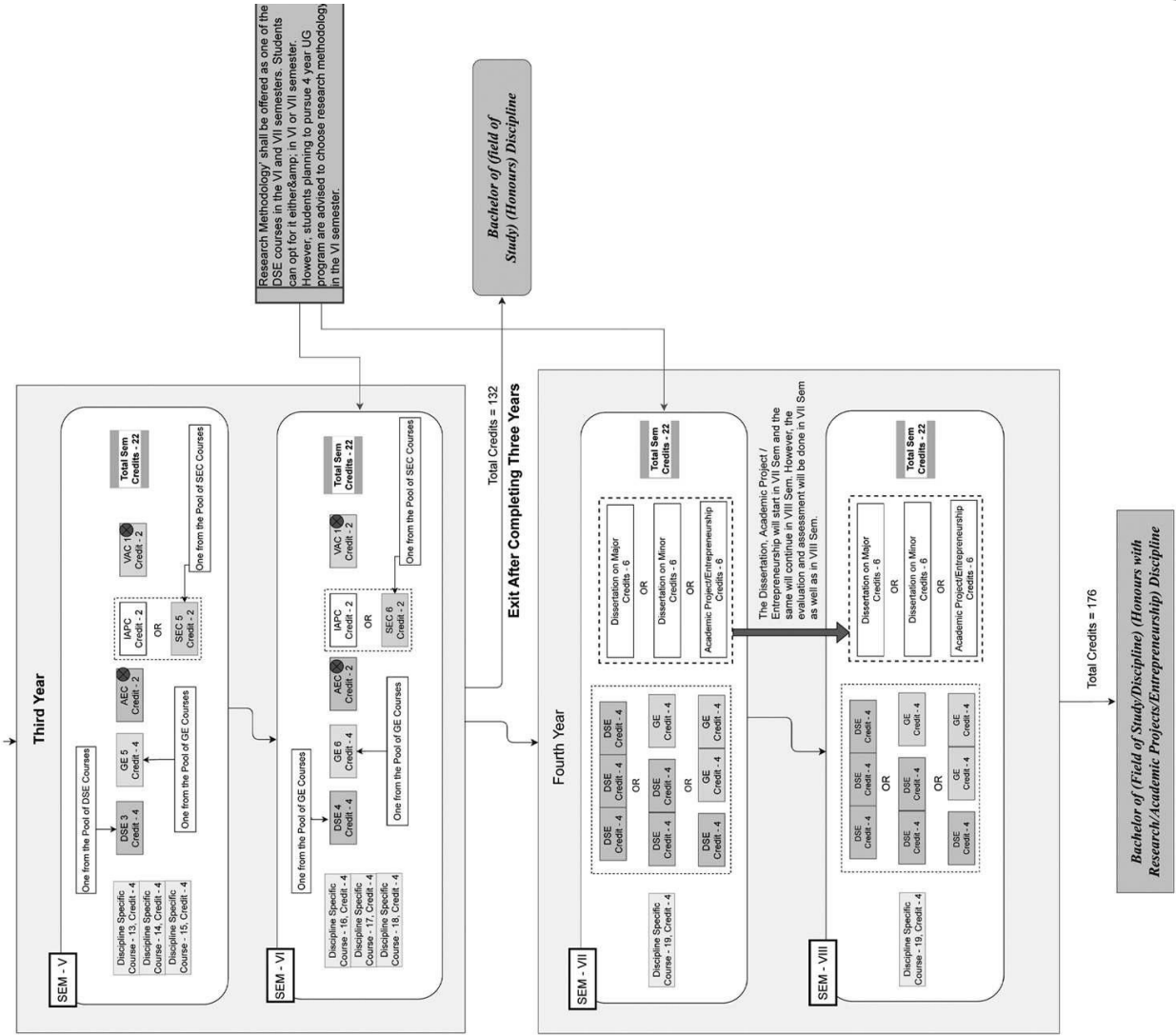
04.12 Simultaneous Admission

A learner can pursue a degree programme and a Diploma or Certificate Course at the same time. Learners pursuing degree programmes under any conventional University can simultaneously take admission in a Degree/ Diploma/ Certificate programmes offered by this University. However, a learner shall not be allowed to pursue two Degree programmes of this University simultaneously.

Important note: Students studying DSEs offered by any Discipline other than His/Her Core Discipline will be treated as GE for Him/Her.

In a single core discipline program, the student shall Major in the core discipline. However, if he/she wishes to Minor in another discipline then he/she has to earn 28 credits from GE courses of the second discipline.

In four years, a student will study the following number of DSEs,

- DSEs and GEs: 20
- Total DSE paper options : 10 (minimum to be chosen is 4)
- Total GE paper options : 10 (minimum to be chosen is 4)

The student can Minor in another discipline, if he/she fulfills the following criteria:

Seven GEs = Minor
(7 x 4) = 28 credits

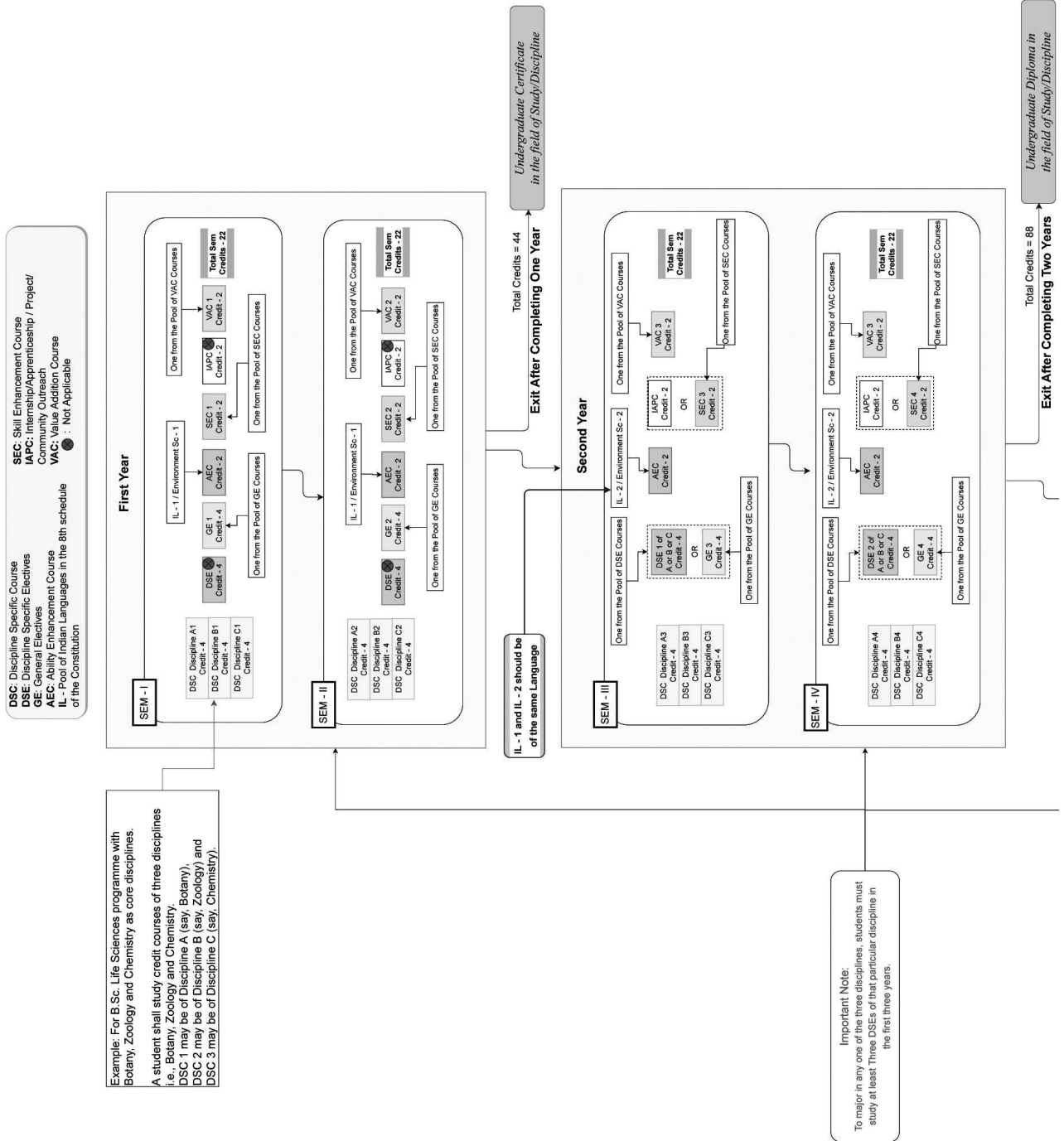
Example: A student is enrolled in B.A. (Hons.) History and decides to pursue 4th year (sem VII + sem VIII).

If he successfully completes the 4th year, he/she will be awarded **Major in History**.

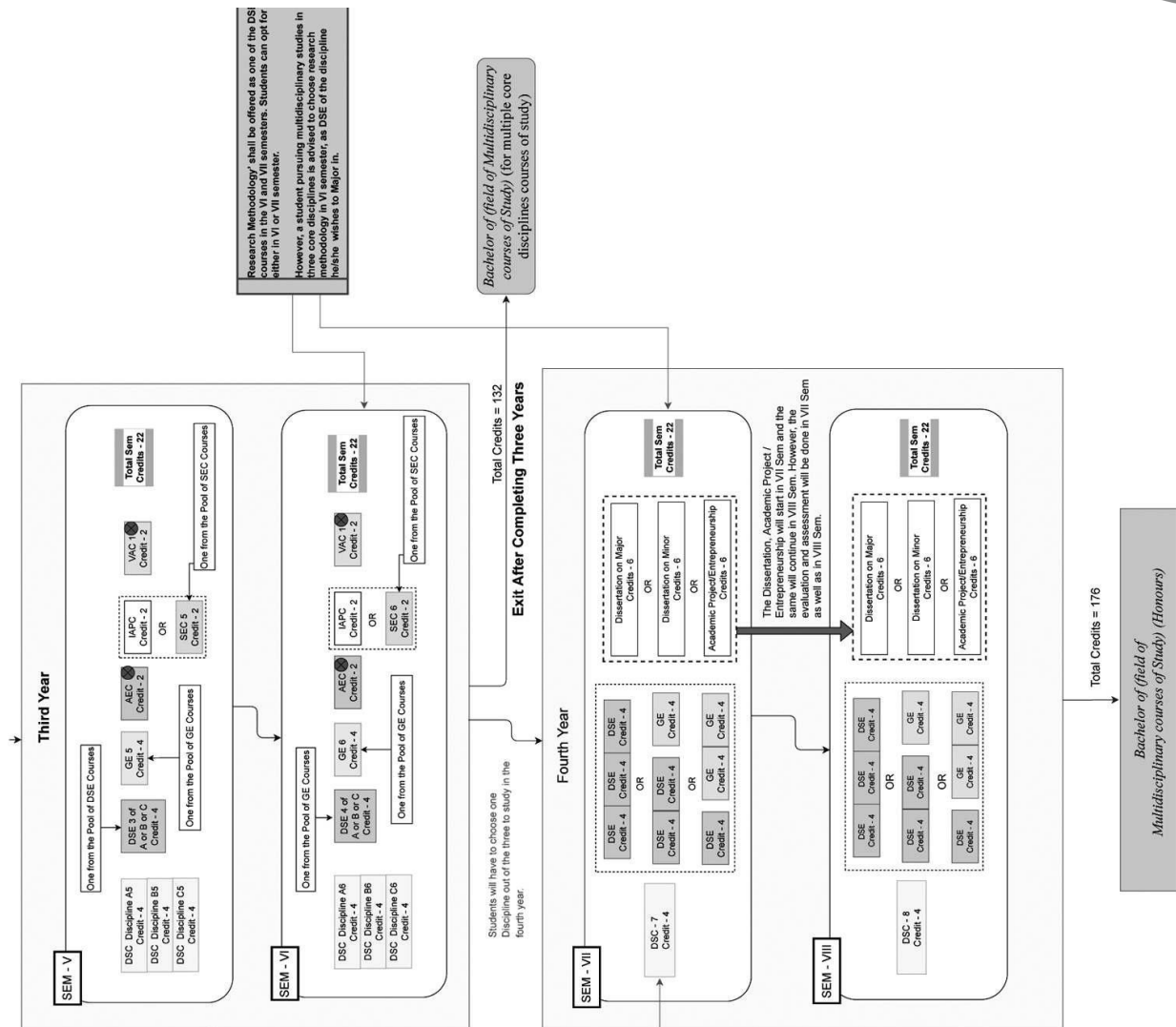
In addition, if the student successfully completes seven GEs in Political Science, he/she will be awarded **Minor in Political Science**.

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Structure of UG Multidisciplinary Program (with Three Core disciplines)



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Research Methodology' shall be offered as one of the DSE courses in the VI and VII semesters. Students can opt for either in VI or VII semester.
However, a student pursuing multidisciplinary studies in three core disciplines is advised to choose research methodology in VI semester, as DSE of the discipline he/she wishes to Major in.

Bachelor of (field of) Multidisciplinary courses of Study (for multiple core disciplines courses of study)

Total Credits = 132
Exit After Completing Three Years

Students will have to choose one Discipline out of the three to study in the fourth year.

In the fourth year (Sem VII and Sem VIII), students will study only one of the discipline i.e., either A or B or C in both of the semesters.

Honours Degree: To pursue an Honours degree in a field of multidisciplinary study, candidates will have to choose, in the fourth year, only one of the disciplines (either A or B or C). Candidates will have to study **Two DSCs and Six DSEs** in the chosen discipline in the VII and VIII semesters and write dissertation.

Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfillment of the following conditions.
Major -> 80 credits, Minor -> 28 credits

Example: B.Sc. Life Sciences programme with Botany, Zoology and Chemistry as core disciplines.

Case I: He/She shall get **Major** in Botany, on successful completion of VIII semester, if he/she earns minimum 80 credits in Botany from **Eight DSCs** and at least **Nine DSEs** of Botany and writes dissertation in Botany.

Advice: Students are advised to choose the discipline in which they wish to Major and must study at least **Three DSEs** of that discipline in the first three years. Like in this example, student must decide earlier and study three DSEs of Botany in the first three years as only maximum of six DSEs are available in fourth year. Similarly, if the student want to minor in any of the remaining two disciplines, he/she should study one DSE of that discipline in the first three years.

He/She shall get a **Minor** in Zoology, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from **Six DSCs** and **one DSE** of Zoology. Or He/She shall get a **Minor** in Chemistry, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from **Six DSCs** and **One DSE** of Chemistry.

Case II: If a student doesn't do dissertation in Botany, but in other disciplines, say Zoology or Chemistry, or does Academic Project or Entrepreneurship, then he/she will not be awarded Major in Botany as he/she will be unable to get 80 credits. In such cases, he/she will be awarded B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences.

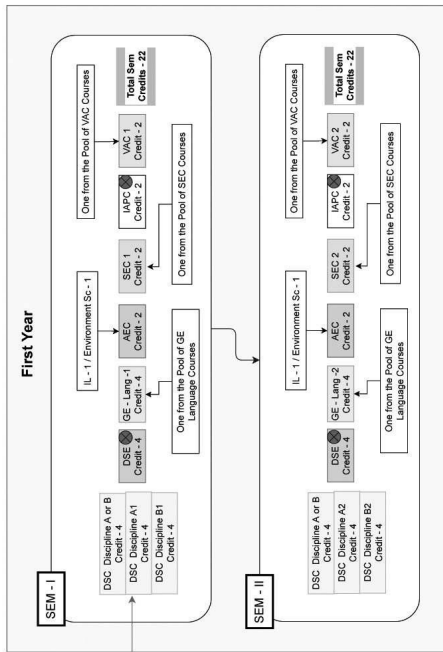

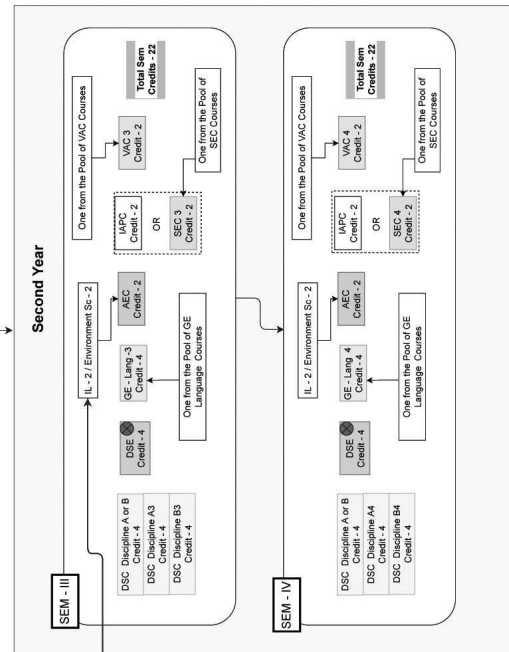

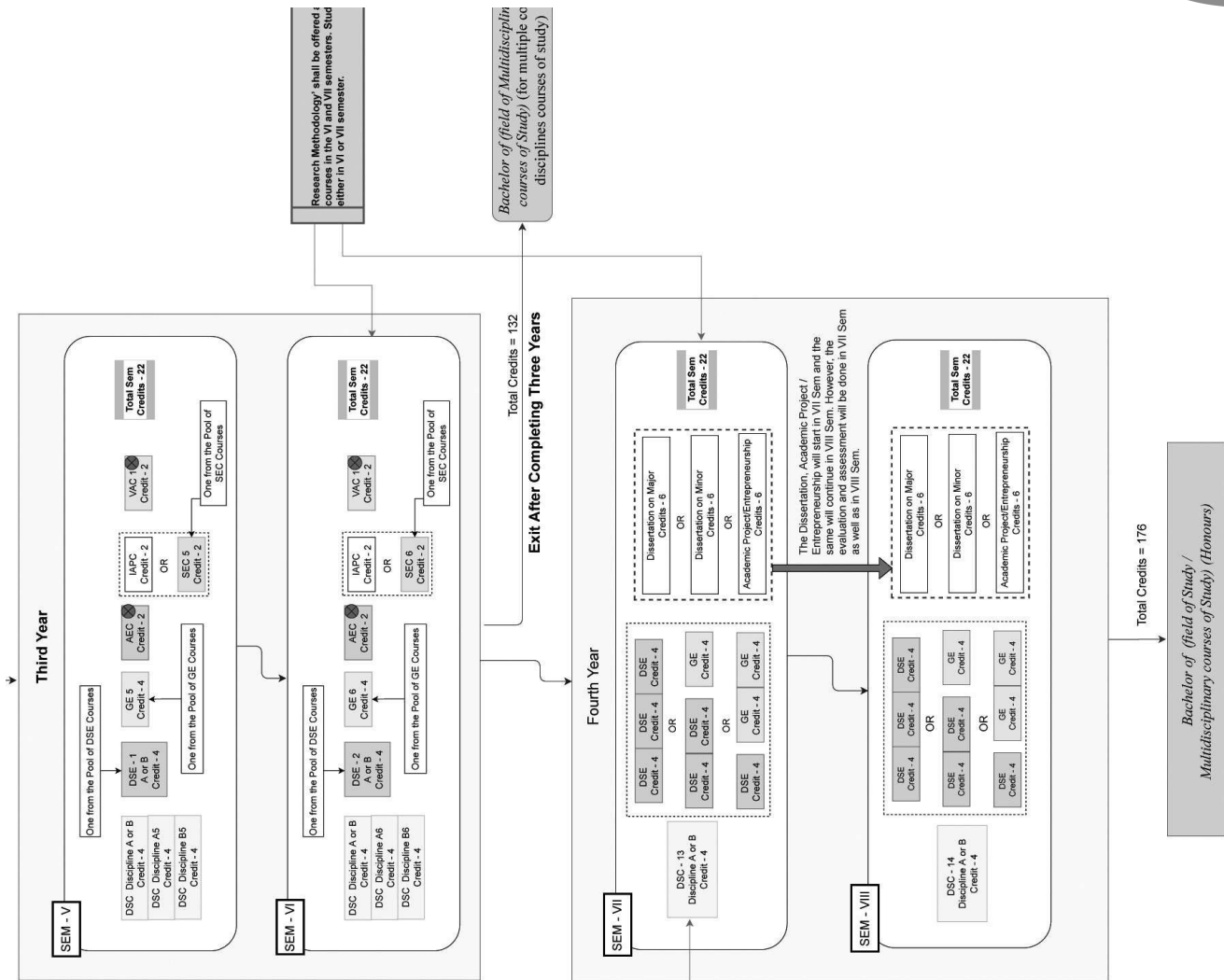

In the fourth year, students will study only one of the discipline i.e., either A or B in both Sem VII and Sem VIII semesters.

To pursue Four years Honours degree in B.A. (Program), student shall study in the fourth year, the discipline, in which he/she has studied at least 10 DSCs in the first three years. Students will have to study the **Two** DSCs and upto **Six** DSEs in the chosen discipline in the VII and VIII semesters.

Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions.

- Major = 80 credits
- Minor = 28 credits

Example: If a student wishes to **Major** in Discipline A, then he/she should earn at least 80 credits in discipline A.

He/she should study **Two** DSCs, **Six** DSEs and write dissertation in VII and VIII semesters.

If the sum total of the DSCs and DSEs of Discipline A is less than 80 credits, then the credits earned in the dissertation written on a topic of Discipline A shall also be taken into consideration to complete the requisite 80 credits

For Example: A student pursues four years B.A. (Honours) in History.

He/She shall get Major in History, on successful completion of VIII semester, if he/she earns Minimum 80 credits in History from:

- 14 DSCs + 8 DSEs = 88 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 7 DSEs = 84 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 6 DSEs = 80 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 5 DSEs + Dissertation = 88 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 4 DSEs + Dissertation = 84 Credits
- 14 DSCs + 3 DSEs + Dissertation = 80 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 8 DSEs = 80 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 7 DSEs + Dissertation = 88 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 6 DSEs + Dissertation = 84 Credits
- 12 DSCs + 5 DSEs + Dissertation = 80 Credits

He/She shall get a **Minor** in Economics, if he/she earns **minimum 28 credits** from **Six** DSCs and **one** DSE..

06. **OUTLINE OF COURSES UNDER B.U.**

The broad categories of courses and minimum credits required for the 4-year Honours degrees as per the UGC document are as follows:

1. Major (Core) course/paper : 80 credits
2. Minor course/paper : 32 credits
3. Interdisciplinary course/paper (IDC) : 9 credits
4. Ability Enhancement Course/paper (AEC) : 8 credits
5. Skill Enhancement Course/paper (SEC) : 9 credits
6. Value Added Course/paper (VAC) : 8 credits
7. Summer Internship : 2 credits
8. Research Project/ Dissertation : 12 credits (for Honours with Research degree)

The following points may be noted :

- In lieu of the Research Project, a student may study 3 courses each of 4 credits (i.e. total 12 credits), leading to an Honours degree (without Research).
- For the 4-year Honours degrees the Major subject/ discipline requires 80 credits and the . Minor subject/ discipline requires 32 credits.
- For a Double Major, the minimum credit requirements are 48 (3-year degree) and 60 (4- year Honours degree) respectively in a subject/ discipline other than the original Major.
- In the UGC framework, papers in Major and Minor disciplines are categorized into levels of 100, 200, 300 and 400. Therefore, a course (paper) offered by a Department, say with 4 credits and of level 200, may be taken both as a Major (Core) course by one student and as a Minor course by another student having a different Major discipline, possibly in different semesters.

06.1 **Overview and structure**

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a minimum credit allocation of 20. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3-year programme is 120 and for a 4-year programme, it is 160. The minimum credit requirements for BU's FYUGP are as follows :

06.2 Course-wise credit requirements

06.3 Curricular Components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts- (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

06.3.1 Core courses

The core courses constitute Majors and Minors. A student will choose one Major subject and a Minor subject. Different options are described in the next section. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3-year programme. In four year programme, minimum credit required for major is 80 and minor is 32.

Major Course

The minimum credit requirement for a Major Course over a 3-year period is 60, accumulated from 15 Courses and 80 credits for 4 years UG programme from 20 Courses.

Minor Course

The minimum credit requirement for a Minor Course over a 3-year period is 24, accumulated from 6 papers and 32 credits for 4 year UG programme from 8 Courses.

Double Major Course

Provided a student has a Major Course with 60 credits, he/she can convert his/her Minor Course to a Double Major only with a credit allocation of 48 for 3 years and 64 for 4 years.



06.3.2 Common courses

As per the NEP guidelines, the following courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP:

(a) Value Addition Courses (VAC) : The VAC courses will come from four subgroups – (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 8.

Each student will have to take any two courses, each of 4-credits, from any four groups during Semesters 1 & 2. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

(b) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) : It includes Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication) and AEC is divided into four Courses each of 2 credits from semester 1-4.

Each student needs to complete four courses of 2 credits each- two from English Usage and other two from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. These courses have to be taken during Semesters 1-4.

(c) Interdisciplinary Courses (IDC) : These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects – (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of 0-99.

Each student needs to take up any three courses; each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters I-III and these courses should not be studied at higher secondary level.

(d) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) : These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. In our structure, we shall have 3 (three) skill courses starting from Semesters I-III.

(e) Internship : All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out within six semesters. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

(f) Vocational Courses

06.4 Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

All credits a student earns at the end of an examination in BU-FYUGP will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such it is mandatory that a student under BU-FYUGP registers for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.



07. PROGRESSION AND EXITS

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year (Certificate in UG programme)

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra vocational course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirement is 40 (and 4 credits extra for the exit vocational course).

(b) After 2 Years (Diploma in UG programme)

One can exit the programme after two-years as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra vocational course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirement is 80 (and 4 credits extra for the exit vocational course).

(c) After 3 Years (UG Degree)

If a student completes 3 years and earns required credit, she/he will be awarded Bachelor's Degree with major or with double major.

(d) After 4 Years [Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Honours with Research)]

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) with single or double major depending on the credit he/she has earned. Students will be eligible for Honours with Research, if he/she earns at least 75% marks or equivalent CGPA in the first six semesters. For Honours with Research a student needs to complete a 12 credit Course on Research Project/Dissertation.

07.1 Multiple exits and entries

As per UGC's Curriculum Framework (December, 2022).

08. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1. Candidates willing to admit themselves in the college have to apply in the prescribed form which can be downloaded from college website. Admission forms and Prospectus can be downloaded free of cost from our official website. Admission notice will be served at the notice board and in college website. Students are to be admitted both in merit and quota basis. Regarding admission, pressure from outside and from any corner is strictly prohibited.

2. There are reservations of seats for SC/ST/OBC/ MOBC as per govt. rules. A few seats are also reserved for students having proficiency in sports, culture, NCC and NSS. At the time of admission the candidates have to submit their original certificates and mark sheets for verification and they must be present physically with their guardians.



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3. The following documents have to be produced in original by a candidate at the time of admission.

- i) Mark sheets.
- ii) Pass Certificate from the head of the institution last attended
- iii) Passport size photograph.
- iv) Gap Certificate is necessary (Wherever applicable)
- v) Age proof Certificate (HSLC Admit Card.)
- vi) Bank A/C No. photo copy.
- vii) Aadhar Card photo copy.

08.1. Admission on Offline/Online (How to Apply)

Students seeking admission in Degree 1st semester and H.S. 1st year classes can apply offline/online by clicking the tab "Online Admission Form" available on the home page of www.northkamrupcollege.org & for H.S. availing Darpan Portal or obtaining off line admission form from the office physically. For B.A. 1st Semester students will have to must register their name through SAMARTH, e-Govt. admission portal, Assam. The creation of ABC is must for maintenance of academic records of B.A. students permanently for future use.

Students seeking admission will first apply by filling up the offline/online form to be made available in the college website or in office. They will be selected on merit basis and the merit list will be published in the college website or college notice board and SMS will be sent to the registered mobile number of the selected students. Finally, selected students have to accept the admission offer by logging in the admission portal through their user ID and password to get themselves admitted or appearing before admission board physically on specified date.

09. COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

- 1) The students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority.
- 2) A student shall be subject to disciplinary action if he / she is found to be disobedient or indecent in his / her behavior with the teachers and the college authority.
- 3) All students must put on the college uniform Dress during college hour as well as during different college functions.
- 4) Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college campus. If anyone is found involving in such offence, stern action will be taken against the offender as per existing rules and regulations.
- 5) The Unions and Associations shall be governed by the college authority.
- 6) Only such Unions and Associations as have been recognized by the Principal shall have the facilities in the college premises.
- 7) All notices desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the college shall require the permission / approval of the Principal
- 8) The power of maintaining discipline is vested with the Principal and his decision shall be final in all such matters.
- 9) Use of mobile phones inside classroom is strictly prohibited. Students violating this rule would invite disciplinary action from the concerning authority.
- 10) Students must appear in all the unit tests, selection test Examinations, Sessional Examinations conducted by the college. Participation in seminars is also compulsory.
- 11) Results of defaulters on account of college, Hostel, NSS, Sports, Students' Union, Library matters will be kept withheld.
- 12) 75% attendance in classes is compulsory. Otherwise students will be treated as non-collegiate. A non-collegiate fee will be charged as per G.U./B.U./AHSEC rules.
- 13) Each and every student of the college will get a non-transferable identify card and it is expected that he /she will carry it all the times inside the college premises. In case the card is lost concerned authority must be informed immediately.



- 14) Students are expected to grow the habit of reading the college notice boards regularly. Any notice that has to be circulated in the college through the notice board must be approved by the college authority.
- 15) It is considered to be the duty of each and every student to keep the college campus clean at all costs. Spitting, writing, and sticking anything on the walls in the college campus will be treated as a punishable offence.
- 16) In order to conserve energy, each and every student is expected to grow and practice the habit of switching off fans and lights when not in use.
