

Workshop on IPR Laws in India

A workshop titled 'IPR Laws in India was Organized by the Department of Economics on 07-09-2019. Dr. J.C. Kalita, Associate Professor and Head of Department of Economics acted as the resource parson. The objective of the workshop was to make the participants aware about IPR Laws in India. A total mo. of 55 participants participated in the programme (including both teachers and students).

The priogramme was inaugurated by P.K. Das
Associate Professor, Department of Economics at 1:00 PM
Which was followed by the speech of the resource person.
The resource person bogan his speech by giving a
brief idea about Intellectual Prioperty Rights (IPR).
Then he want on to explain about the types of
IPR. He explained about the 7 types of IPR,
viz - copyright, tradements, patents, geographical indications,
plant vorieties, industrial designs and semiconductor
integrated circuit layous design.

Enploying the IPR Laws, he mentioned that the laws and administrative procedures relating to IPR have their roots in Europe The trend of granting patents started in 14th century. Regarding IPR Laws in India, he explained

about Jew acts viz. Traclemanks Act, 1999,
The patents Act, 1970, the Copyright Act, 1957,
the designs Act, 2000, the Goognaphical Indication
of Goods Registration and Protection Act, 1999
and the Information Technology Act, 2000. Dr.
Kalita ended his speech by highlighting the
importance of the IPR Laws in India.
